A Lorry Load of Trouble

Huge articulated lorries deliver to the Co-op Store next to All Saints C of



E Primary School in Church Road, several times a day. This in itself is a health and safety issue.

The HGVs are too big for the Store's car park and have to turn around in the narrow main road frequently causing damage to property. Unfortunately, the Co-op does not have any smaller lorries that it can use for its deliveries.

A positive meeting was held on Friday, 30 August 2013 with concerned residents, Parish Councillors, Cheshire West and Chester Councillor Brian Crowe, Stephen Mosley MP and representatives of the Co-op, who were extremely helpful.

As a result, from 21 September 2013 delivery rotas will be adjusted so that there are only deliveries between 6 and 7am. Other adjustments will be made including moving the recycling boxes and sign and cordoning of parking bays whilst deliveries are in operation. Also, improved signage will be put in place to make the one way system clearer.

Lodge Lane Affordable Housing



Rowlinson Construction started work on site on 8 July 2013, work is progressing well. Foundations have commenced on four blocks, shortly we are hopeful that all the various Highways and Drainage agreements will be in place to allow work to commence on the new access road onto the site. The overhead line was removed by Scottish Power on 30 August and this has now opened up the full site to commence construction.

One of the planning conditions is to ensure that an Archaeologist visits the site during the foundation works to inspect, so far there have been no archaeological finds, but we will let you know of any interesting finds if we have any!

Rowlinson have registered the scheme with Considerate Constructors and an inspection will take place shortly.

We are committed to providing local labour and training opportunities where possible on this scheme and since the works started, Rowlinson have employed a full time person from Saughall to work on the site.



National School Meals Week (NSMW)



This year NSMW will fall on 4 to 8 November 2013.

There has never been a better time to celebrate everything that is great about a school lunch and that is the theme for this year's event. The aims include:

- asking caterers to provide a FREE meal to every pupil in their school who wants one on one day during the week – so they can see just how good they are;
- encouraging non users to trial the service; and
- encouraging as many people as possible to sign up as Ambassadors for the event, in doing so registering their support for the school meals industry and all it does to provide quality school meals at great value

to our children – in summary, celebrating all that is great about school lunches.

Cheshire West and Chester Council was the first Local Authority in England and Wales to sign up for The Great Free School Lunch initiative taking place during NSMW. It has signed up to promise a free school meal to all its primary and special school pupils during NSMW.

This is a great opportunity to promote school meals, and all the benefits that go with them, such as healthy eating and improved concentration.



A petition calling for the crackdown attracted 1,569 signatures and sparked a debate at Cheshire West and Chester Council meeting.

A residents in attendance at the meeting told Councillors: "You have recently implemented the cycling strategy, which is great. Now let's take the next logical step and implement 20mph speed limits in all residential areas. What is there to wait for? We can't afford to put this off."

Councillor David Robinson put forward a motion calling to bring forward the 20mph restrictions. He said:

"This is about road safety. It's about protecting vulnerable road-users."

But Cllr Gareth Anderson argued:

"Many people believe - and I think perfectly reasonably – that a blanket 20mph speed limit everywhere is the wrong thing to do."

He said the lowered limit could only be effective and enforceable in areas where the local community has specifically requested it to be introduced.

The issue will now be discussed further at a scrutiny committee meeting.

A "No-Crash" Course to make Driving Safer

West and Chester Council.

Motorists have the opportunity to become safer on the roads by attending a Driver Awareness Briefing being hosted by Cheshire

The two-hour session will deal with defensive driving techniques, hazard awareness, and reducing stress to lessen the risk of being involved in a crash.

The free event is available to everyone, from company drivers and those who use their car to commute to work, to those who have held a licence for many years and may only drive in their local area or occasionally for leisure.

It will take place at Hoole Community Centre, Westminster Road, Chester, CH2 3AU on Wednesday, 2 October 2013, from 7pm to 9pm and is being organised by Road Safety Officers from the Safe and Sustainable Travel Team.

The briefing will include road safety advice to extend driving knowledge, skills and confidence and develop tolerance and consideration for other road users.

Saughall Postal Scheme – December 2013

This December I am going to introduce and run Saughall's very own private post scheme. The idea is to provide post boxes around the village to send

Christmas cards and greetings to other

people in the village. The posted cards will be delivered by me and other volunteers. It is not a new scheme as the uniformed groups/scouts have run similar schemes in various parts of the country. The scheme in North Wirral has run for over 20 years and has raised many thousands of pounds in that time.

The idea is to raise money towards the refurbishment at the Vernon Institute and the new pavilion at the Golden Jubilee Park. Although the money raised will be nowhere near enough to cover the costs of either project it will show a willing intent to any matched funding that the village can raise.

Collections will be on a regular basis and deliveries the same so although it will not be a guaranteed next day delivery, it won't be far off that. The scheme will begin in late November and run as late as possible up to Christmas (depending on volume and uptake). Only cards to be delivered in Saughall should be posted and no valuables of any description should be sent.

The cost will definitely be much less than the Royal Mail. The final cost of stamps has not been agreed yet but will be well below the cost of a Royal Mail second class stamp – probably half the cost. Stamps will be for sale in local outlets/shops.

As well as the main part of the village the areas to be covered will be along Saughall Road to the Blacon boundary, all of Fiddlers Lane and Kingswood Lane, the A540 from Fiddlers Lane to the end of Long Lane, all of Long Lane, all of Long Lane up to the motorway and down Seahill Road up to Sealand Road including any housing estates which border Seahill Road.

Do Something 'Special' Today



Cheshire Constabulary has launched a Special Constabulary recruitment campaign – by calling on people to do something 'Special' today by getting involved in policing as a volunteer Special Constable.

The Special Constabulary is a force of trained volunteers who play a crucial role in fighting crime and making our streets safer. They work in partnership with regular officers to assist in solving local policing problems, perform policing duties at events and provide public reassurance in towns and villages across Cheshire.

Special Constables come from all walks of life. They have the drive and determination to devote some of their free time to working with the police to improve the quality of their communities.

Police and Crime Commissioner John Dwyer says: "Becoming a Special Constable is a great opportunity for people to give their time to make a difference. Whether you want to give something back to your community, learn new skills or simply challenge yourself, there are opportunities for everyone."

A Special Constable is asked to work a minimum of 17 hours per month and, where possible, this is broken down to a minimum of 4 hours per week. However, the working hours are flexible so that volunteers can give more time if they can spare it. In return, they have the opportunity to learn new transferable skills and gain valuable experience within a

professional environment.

Special Constables will receive extensive training together with ongoing support and supervision to ensure they feel comfortable to carry out your duties.

Could you be a "LION OF CHESTER"?

Back in 1959 Chester Insurance Professional Ted Williams heard about Lions Clubs International from a business contact who was a member of Birmingham Lions Club.

At the time the nearest Lions Clubs were in Crewe and Blackpool. Ted Williams was able to start the ball rolling in Chester by gaining the interest of a number of Chester businessmen. As a result, early in 1960, a Lions Club was chartered in Chester with Harold Jenkins as the first President.

Now 53 years later the Lions Club of Chester is going as strong as ever and there are Lions Clubs in more than 200 countries with more than 1.3million members worldwide. Over the years Chester Lions Club has raised more than £2million for local good causes and to support those less fortunate in our local community.
