Superfast Fibre Broadband Arrives in Saughall



Councillor Brian Crowe – Saughall and Mollington Ward, Parish Councillors Andrew Warrington and Dennis Holman, Stephen Mosley MP for Chester, Jenny Young, Chairman of Saughall and Shotwick Park Parish Council and Jenny Westwood of BT.

The £28.5m Connecting Cheshire Partnership has announced that its new fibre-optic network - bringing speeds of up to 80 megabits per second (Mbps) - is now becoming available across the Saughall telephone exchange area as part of its roll-out to more than 80,000 homes and businesses across Cheshire. Additional areas will become live during the autumn and winter.

It's not just about a faster internet experience or doing one thing quicker, it's about everyone being able to do their own thing online, all at the same time. You can work or play - smarter, faster, better – whether from your smart phone, tablet or computer. Check the Connecting Cheshire website www.connectingcheshire.org.uk to see if your home or business can be upgraded and then contact your Internet Service Provider or shop around for the best deal and order a fibre broadband service - it doesn't happen automatically but it shouldn't cost more than your current broadband service!

Connecting Cheshire, a partnership between BT and Cheshire West and Chester, Cheshire

East, Halton and Warrington Councils, aims to reach an additional 80,000 homes and businesses with fibre broadband. This is in addition to BT's commercial investment in fibre across Cheshire, Halton and Warrington so that by the end of 2015 a total of 400,000 premises (around 96%) will have access to high-speed broadband.

The Connecting Cheshire Partnership is keen to feature any case studies of residents or businesses that upgrade and exploit the benefits of faster broadband. If you have a project that could be considered please contact the Clerk or any Parish Councillor.

Multi Use Games Area (MUGA) – Update

As we reported in the last Newsletter, Leisure Surfaces, a company based in Hankelow near

Crewe has been awarded the contract to provide and install the MUGA at a cost of £54,240. The Parish Council has already paid a third party contribution of £4,288.68 to FCC Recycling (UK) Ltd

Unfortunately, there has been a delay as the Council waits for Waste Recycling Environmental Ltd (WREN), who is match funding the project with Cheshire West and Chester Council, to register the project with its regulators (Entrust) and draft the funding agreement.

We now hope that all the necessary paperwork can be completed to allow the contractor to start on site at the end of September/early October 2014.



Golden Jubilee Park

The Parish Council has agreed to erect a fence between the Park and the next

field (on the Council's side) at a cost of £2,525. This will prevent the horses in the field escaping and causing damage to the cricket square etc.

The Council has recognised the need to modernise the offer for younger children in the Swing Park. Consequently, a survey has been conducted in respect of the play equipment/facilities provided and on what people would like to see provided for the children in the 21st Century. A 'picture board' is being produced and a number of companies have been approached and are putting forward proposals that could be incorporated into the Park.

Final Recommendations for the Community Governance Reviews of Saughall and Shotwick Park Parishes

Following the Community Governance Review Cheshire West and Chester Council has made the following recommendations: That

1. the boundary of the existing parish of Saughall be redrawn to the north at the A5117 to transfer the properties of Pitts Farm, Willow Barn, Oakwood Farm, Hill View Farm, Rose Farm, Northfield, The Gibbet Windmill, Saughall Mill Farm, Saughall Mill Farm Cottage, Mill Cottage North, Mill Cottage South and Rendova Farm from Saughall parish to Woodbank parish;
2. the boundary of the existing parish of Shotwick Park be redrawn to the north at the A5117 to transfer the properties of 3 Woodbank Lane, The Covert, Blue Haze, Orchard View, Park Farm, Roughwood Farm, The Willows and Fourways Farm from Shotwick Park parish to Woodbank parish;
3. the boundary of the existing parish of Saughall be redrawn to the south to transfer the property of 49 Melverley Drive from Saughall parish to the Chester unparished area;
4. the grouping of the existing parishes of Saughall and Shotwick Park under the single common council of Saughall and Shotwick Park be dissolved;
5. the parishes of Saughall and Shotwick Park be amalgamated to constitute a new single parish comprising the area of those parishes;
6. the new parish shall be known as Saughall and Shotwick Park;
7. in consequence of paragraph (5) above, the existing parishes of Saughall and Shotwick Park shall cease to exist;
8. a new local council for the area be created;
9. the local council for the area adopt the style of "parish";
10. the new parish shall not be warded;
11. the parish council for the parish of Saughall and Shotwick Park consist of 12 members; and
12. a Cheshire West and Chester Borough Council (Reorganisation of Community

Governance) Order be prepared in accordance with the above recommendations and that the Order be effective from 1st April 2015 save for those recommendations relating to parish electoral arrangements which shall come into force on the ordinary day of election of councillors in May 2015.

The current total electorate for the area is 2478 based on the Register of Electors in force from 17 February 2014. This figure is expected to increase to 2544 within the next five years. However, the boundary changes detailed in recommendations (1), (2) and (3) will reduce the forecasted electorate to 2506. Similar sized ungrouped parishes have Parish Councils of between nine and 12 seats.

The proposed boundary change detailed in recommendation (3) will transfer a property from a parished area into a currently unparished one. Whilst this would not normally be an expected outcome from a community governance review, the property is located at the end of a street which was wholly in and is only accessible from the unparished area of Blacon and lies approximately two kilometres from Saughall village.



Individual Electoral Registration (IER)

A new scheme of electoral registration has been introduced across the country, and the transition to this new system began on 10 June this year.

All currently registered electors will have their name and address checked against government records so that they can be confirmed under IER. The vast majority of those on the register will be automatically transferred to the 'IER register' without having to do anything.

Each currently registered elector will then receive a letter from the Electoral Registration Officer to let them know that either:

- they have been confirmed and successfully transferred to the 'IER register' and do

not need to do anything further, or

- they need to provide additional information to their Electoral Registration Officer in order to be registered under IER.

With IER, for the first time, new registrations can be completed on line at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote IER will make registering to vote safer and more convenient.

There is a growing interest in becoming a councillor. We don't have a vacancy at the moment but next May all 12 places will be up for grabs.

When Does the Council Meet?

The Council meets every month. The next meeting is scheduled for 7pm on Monday, 6 October 2014 in the Vernon Institute (VI), Church Road.

Meetings will also be held at 7pm on the following dates:

- Monday, 3 November 2014 (VI);
- Tuesday, 2 December 2014 (Uniformed Groups Headquarters, Fiddlers Lane);
- Monday, 5 January 2015 (VI); and
- Monday, 12 January 2015 (VI) – Budget Meeting.

Notices for all Council meetings are posted on the Council's notice boards and website. Agendas for meetings are always on deposit in the Co-op Store and posted on the Council's website (www.saughall.gov.uk). Any resident on the Electoral Roll of Saughall

or Shotwick Park is more than welcome to attend all of these meetings.

Local Plan (Part One): **Cheshire West and Chester Examination**

An independent examination to determine whether the Cheshire West and Chester Local Plan (Part One) Strategic Policies is sound has concluded. The Inspector's interim report agrees that the Plan is not sound in a number of respects but considers that it can be made sound through some modifications.

The Principal Authority is now working with the Inspector and on the Plan to make it more robust. Consequently, there is to be further public consultation in the autumn on this. The consultation period is expected to run for six weeks from 8 September to 17 October 2014.

Community Right to Bid

Under Part 5, Chapter 3 of the 2011 Localism Act and the Assets of Community Value Regulations the Parish Council is able to use the Community Right to Bid to 'pause' the sale of buildings or land it cares about. By doing this the local community is given up to six months to develop a bid to buy them, if they are offered for sale. This gives community groups a fairer chance to save assets that are important to them.

The Parish Council has already nominated Conkers, the Greyhound Inn and the field behind the Golden Jubilee Park to be part of the register of 'assets of community value' and is awaiting the Principal Authority's decision.

The Parish Council is aware of the two Cheshire principal authorities' proposal to sell off the Cheshire Farms Estate. It is also aware that Big Wood and Dingle Wood/Bluebell Wood are already recognised as Local Wildlife Sites (LWS) (formerly known as Sites of Biological importance) and as such receive a degree of protection through the planning process. Part of Dingle Wood is also afforded legal protection as part of Shotwick Castle Scheduled Ancient Monument.

Pigeon Wood is not currently recognised as a LWS and will have to meet certain criteria to be considered for inclusion. With no immediate threat from development and the woodland still being in the two Council's ownership a Tree Preservation Order was not appropriate at this time. Forestry Commission Felling licence requirements, which apply to woodlands and trees in the United Kingdom, nevertheless do apply.

The Parish Council is now also making arrangements to nominate Pigeon Wood, Bluebell Wood and Dingle Wood as community assets.

Cheshire West and Chester **Apply, Report or Pay for Services Online**

Are you irritated by a street light which is out, overgrowth obstructing the footway, dog fouling or a pot hole? All these issues and many more can now be reported through Cheshire West and Chester Council's (CWaC) website.

The Borough Council has launched a new customer-friendly feature on its website www.cheshirewestandchester.gov.uk making council services more accessible to you at the click of a button.

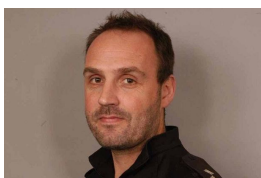
The Borough Council has improved access to waste and recycling services as a new feature allows people to complete a range of requests including reporting missing collections, requesting replacement boxes and bins, removing unwanted containers and requesting assisted and bulky collections.

Other improvements include parking fines – pay or appeal, online payments and school admissions. Residents of the borough can now enjoy the benefits of self service – saving time, being able to track their enquiries and requests, with 24 hours a day, seven days a week access to council services.

Residents can log enquiries and requests at a time convenient to them and are then able to track where they are up to. This new way of working is simple and easy to access and provides a valuable alternative to visiting an office or making a phone call.

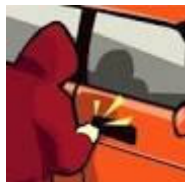
Inspector Brian Green

Whether dog waste, litter, cigarette butts or chewing gum; put it in your nearest Council litter bin.

If you are walking your dog and there is a nearby litter bin, you can simply use this. If

there is no nearby litter bin, take it home and dispose of it in your Council provided household waste bin.



There is no longer a need for expensive specialised bins for dog waste as all the Council's disposal facilities can accept this waste. This means all litter can be simply mixed and disposed of

together. This is easier, cheaper and more convenient.

Business Waste Compliance – will be investigated by the end of the next working day.

Racist or Abusive Graffiti – on relevant land will be removed or obliterated within 24 hours.

Fly Posting – will be investigated and removed from relevant land within 2 working days.

Fly Tipping – will be investigated by the end of the next working day and cleared within 2 working days following completion of the investigation.

Nuisance Vehicles – will be investigated within 2 working days.

Dead Animals – will be removed from relevant land within 24 hours.

Sharps/Drug Related Litter – will be removed from relevant land within 4 hours.

Dog Fouling – will be removed from relevant land within 24 hours.

Overflowing Bins – will be emptied by the end of the next working day.

The Rotary Club of Saughall is a group of friendly people who meet on a Thursday evening in the Greyhound Inn, or All Saints Church Hall. We raise money for good causes and enjoy ourselves in the process.

We support local and international causes. Locally, we have promised money towards the building of the new cricket pavilion. We have also provided funds for the Golden Link Club, the WI, the Uniform Groups, the local churches, All Saints C of E Primary School, the Vernon Institute and the Saughall Colts Football Club. Beyond our village we have also made donations to international appeals, local hospices and charities, such as the Samaritans in Chester.

We've had some great fun raising money – from an auction night, a quiz night, the Chester raft race and the Charity Beer Festival with the Round Table, to the upcoming Santa's Rotary Sleigh. Sometimes we raise money, other times we simply offer our time and our support - such as helping to set up and run the Disabled Games.



This little Club has just raised enough money to build a road thousands of miles away in Swaziland, to connect an isolated and impoverished community to the wider world. The Rotary Club of Saughall led the way

raising £5,000, with the Rotary Club of Mold showing their support by raising £100, and a substantial donation of £5,000 was received from the Charity Swazaid. Our District Foundation matched this combined funding and applied for a Rotary International Global Grant to fund a project to the tune of \$75,616 (approx £46,000). The project includes funding to train local people skills to repair and maintain the road; setting up of a school library in three schools and educational excursions.
