

The Council has also taken the decision, for health and safety reasons, to exclude dogs from the Park. It has asked Chester City Council to apply for a Dog Control Order on the Park prohibiting dogs at all times.

#### Review of the Parish Plan

The Saughall and Shotwick Park Parish Plan – 'Your Village; Your Council Tax; Your Choice' was published in June 2004. The Council has a vision for Saughall:

"To provide a thriving, vibrant community with the opportunity for all residents, including children and young people, to be included in social, recreational and community activities."

To assist this vision the Council Published the Parish Plan. It can be viewed on the internet at http://www.saughall.gov.uk/Minutes/Saughall\_Parish\_Plan.pdf or copies can be obtained from the Clerk. It is a roadmap, a powerful tool that can be used to influence a wide range of issues and projects within our community in the coming years. It was based on true consultation and effective engagement with the whole community and it is regularly reviewed to ensure it achieves our aims and objectives.

The publication of the Plan was the first step and even now we are still very much at the beginning. There will be interesting times ahead as we strive and fight to bring about the changes and improvements we want to see in our village.

This village must develop in a way that suits us. We want the parish planning process to evolve to ensure that we have the facilities and services we want and can expect to enjoy in a rural village in the 21st Century. The Plan is helping us to achieve this. It is a blueprint for the future, a commitment that we will work together to ensure success.

The Council monitors, scrutinises and reviews the progress of the issues highlighted in the Parish Plan and takes appropriate action to bring about change and to improve the quality of life of the residents of Saughall.

At the Council meeting held on 4 September 2006 the Parish Plan was again reviewed and an action list drawn up with timescales as a means to achieve objectives. Issues reviewed and subsequent actions to be taken are detailed below:

Issue	Actions	
Speeding traffic through the village	The Council will invite appropriate Cheshire County Council Officers to meet with it to discuss traffic calming measures that are currently available and, in particular, what would best suit the main roads through the village.	
	Councillors will undergo training on how to use Chester City Council's speedgun. Once trained Councillors will be using the gun regularly in the village to deter speeding.

The proliferation of dog fouling	The Council is promoting the reduction in dog fouling by regular features in this Newsletter and dogs will be banned from the Golden Jubilee Park.	
Provision of additional Affordable Housing	Arena (Housing Association) has funding approval, although at present in reserve. The Council will continue to monitor progress on the proposal to construct 12 No 3 bed/5 person semi-detached 2 storey houses with associated works and a new access on land at Lodge Lane.	

# Children's Playground

The facility continues to be well utilised. It had a detailed annual inspection in the summer. A number of issues were identified which have been addressed. The Parish Council has no immediate plans for new equipment but the existing equipment has been repainted and is looking good.

Further development of the playground will be incorporated into Phase 2 of the Golden Jubilee Park.

#### **Weed Growth**

The County Council is responsible for keeping roadside gutters and pavements clear of weeds. The Parish Council is disappointed at the amount of weed growth on village roads and is taking the matter up. You can help however, by removing any weeds growing in gutters and on pavements outside your property.

#### Garden Waste – Disposal

If you put out grass cuttings or other garden waste in plastic bags the Refuse Collection Team will not take them. They should be taken to the Household Waste Disposal Centre in Bumpers Lane. However, if you put garden waste in cardboard boxes or paper sacks and put them out with the Garden Waste wheelie bin, they will be taken away.

#### **Dog Fouling**

The Dogs (Fouling of Land)
Act 1996 makes it an offence
to allow your dog to foul in public areas and
allows local councils to make on the spot fines.

Clear up after your dog. Put it in one of the red bins provided or take it home with you.

# **Keep Saughall Tidy**

Don't drop litter, put it in one of the many litter bins dotted around the village or take it home.

# Bus Terminus Shelter – Lodge Lane, Saughall

Cheshire County Council informed that under its Parish Bus Shelter Scheme (where the Parish Council pays £1,000 towards the shelter and £500 a year maintenance costs whilst the County Council contributes the rest) it may be possible for a lit shelter with CCTV to be provided at the Terminus in 2007/08.

The Parish Council consulted on the proposal to replace the shelter at the Terminus via the last edition of this Newsletter in June 2006.

In the light of the responses received, the Council has agreed not to support the proposal to replace the bus shelter at the Terminus and Cheshire County Council has been informed accordingly.

#### Think Before You Park!

Please do not park on grass verges or on footpaths.

Remember there are people with prams and pushchairs who will have to step out into the road to get passed your car. Also, have a thought for those of us who are wheelchair bound.

Recently, a number of cars have been parking on the grass verge on Long Lane. These motorists are destroying the verge and the Spring bulbs that have been planted there. Remember the lovely displays we have seen each Spring on the approach to the village.

The Police have been informed of these inappropriate parking "hot spots" and Traffic Wardens will ticket anyone who causes an obstruction.

# Parish Council Meetings Public Speaking Time

You are very welcome to attend Parish Council meetings. Ten minutes are allocated at the beginning of each meeting to enable any petitioners to speak in support of their petition(s) and for questions from the public to be taken, providing five clear working days written notice has been given, or on urgent matters, providing a request is made to the Chairman prior to the commencement of the meeting and Council's consent is given.


#### Scouts/Guides
