Saughall Neighbourhood Management Team

The Team continues to make progress and a list of its activities are set out below:

Running the 'Set the Pace' campaign at the Christmas lights switch-on event and encouraging people to sign up

Representing the Parish Council at Carillion's Parish Councils Liaison Meetings in respect of the A5117 road improvement scheme

Contacting the Department of Transport for road safety booklets and collected them from Wrexham

Trying to set up other fitness activities without success

Looking into Cycle proficiency courses

Looking into care for people within Saughall who do not fall under the Principal Authority's Older People's Services umbrella

Negotiating high visibility vests from Carillion for village children

Negotiating high visibility arm/leg bands from a local company

Applying pressure to the Principal Authority in an attempt to get a pedestrian crossing, flashing school sign and a 20mph speed limit at the school

Good Neighbour and Community Awards

In the last Newsletter, published in January 2009, the Council introduced a Good Neighbour and Community Awards Scheme in recognition of outstanding achievement and to promote community spirit. Awards are in the form of framed certificates. Unfortunately, by the closing date of 31 March 2009 no nominations had been received.

This is disappointing but the Council does plan to publicise and run this scheme again next year in the hope that electors can be persuaded to make nominations in recognition of good deeds or continuous unpaid and voluntary work/service/actions that have been carried out by villagers for the benefit of the community as a whole.



Chairman's Annual Report 2008/09

The Chairman presented her Annual Report at the Annual Parish Meeting held on Monday, 27 April 2009. The report details the work of the Council over the last year. It is set out below in its entirety.

Introduction

As the Municipal year comes to a close it is time once again to reflect upon Parish

Council activity within the community during the past twelve months.

Change in Membership

Councillor Philomena Humphrey resigned from the Council in January 2009. I pay tribute to her and thank her for her hard work whilst she was on the Parish Council. A By-election was held last Thursday and Kathy Ford was duly elected. I look forward to working with her.

The New Council – Cheshire West and Chester

On 31 March 2009 Cheshire County and the six District Councils were abolished and we now share the new Cheshire West and Chester Unitary Council with the former boroughs of Vale Royal, Ellesmere Port and Neston and the City of Chester. The administrative headquarters are at the County Hall. Whether this new arrangement will prove more efficient and cost effective remains to be seen.

I would like to put on record our thanks to former County Councillor David Rowlands and wish him well for the future. David regularly attended our meetings and kept us abreast of County policies and initiatives. I would also like to thank former Chester City Councillors Andrew and Jeanne Storrar for their help and support over the years when they represented this village on the City Council. Of course they are both still Parish Councillors and Andrew is now representing us on the new Council.

Finance

The Council's budgets for the financial years 2008/09 and 2009/10 are as follows:

2008/09	£59,710.00
2009/10	£62,590.00

Unlike the new unitary Council, the Parish Council does not receive Government grants and is funded by means of the local Council Tax - £44.53 per household per band D property.

For the last four years Chester City Council has made a double taxation grant. This grant was population based and in 2008/09 amounted to approximately £4,000. However, the new Council decided not to award this grant. This loss in grant had to be taken into account when the Parish Council's budget was set and had serious implications on the level of the parish precept. It has increased by 10% on the previous year but if the grant had been paid the precept would have gone up by only 3%. The Parish Council has made a number of representations over the injustice of this action. It means that parished areas of the Chester District are being disadvantaged in comparison with the rest of the area served by the new Council.

The grant has not been reinstated but we have been told that the new Council is committed to reviewing the grants and payments that have been made to Parish Councils during the coming year and is looking forward to working with all Parish And Town Councils in a positive way during this process and is giving Parish and Town Councils greater involvement in the delivery of services in their communities as it develops its thinking on Area Partnership Boards and Community Forums.

Parish Council Surgeries

Since October 2008 a new approach has been taken to Parish Council Surgeries because the Parish Council believes that it is important that it is openly accessible and available to parishioners who want to discuss quality of life issues etc with its Members. Surgeries are still held monthly between 10.00am and 10.45am on the Saturday immediately before the Council meeting on the first Monday of the month (second Monday if the first is a public holiday). They are held outside the Co-op Stores and the dates are published on the notice boards.

Vernon Institute

The Council has a savings fund so that when work is required it is able to contribute to the

costs of improving the building and fabric of the Vernon Institute, a listed building and an important community facility and village meeting point. During the last year the Council has contributed £2,739, which is 50% of the cost of the work undertaken.

Partnership Working and the PCSO Initiative

This village has had its own PCSO since 1 April 2007 when Mike Butler took up the position. The Council has a three-year agreement with the Cheshire Constabulary and has contributed £11,000 each year. We are now in the final year of the agreement and if we continue to support a PCSO post in the village, the sum is likely to increase.

Mike Butler moved to another area in January and I would like to put on record the Council's thanks and appreciation of his help and support over the two years he was attached to Saughall and wish him well in his future career. PCSO Sue Morrison has now taken over from Mike. She is getting to know Saughall and its people. Her role is to provide a visible uniformed presence and make a contribution to the reduction of crime and disorder and the promotion of public reassurance and quality of life.

Saughall Neighbourhood Management Team

The Council used its partnership with the police as a mechanism to form a Neighbourhood Management Team with other partners including the Cheshire Fire Service and community volunteers. The Team is funded for a three-year period through a £10,000 grant from the Cheshire Community Council and its aim is to make Saughall and Shotwick Park a safer place for us all to live. It's now in its second year of operation. It's made up of volunteers and its activities are co-ordinated extremely well by Tony Summers. Thanks Tony.

Golden Jubilee Park

The Council has continued to develop the Park by adding a 4-metre high play net at a cost of £10,921.30. This was part funded by

a £5,000 grant from Chester City Council. We also installed a combination goal end and tarmac pad for ball games at a cost of £17,950. Chester City Council gave us another grant of £2,300 towards it. The funding difference was met from our Golden Jubilee Park Designated Fund.

Following difficulties with installation, the stepping-stones and balancing beam are now also in-situ, along with four park benches that the Council has had in storage for some time. Unfortunately, some of the benches have been subjected to mindless vandalism. The car park continues to flood when it rains. We are ascertaining what can be done to solve this problem.

The New School and the Thomas Wedge CE (Controlled) Junior School

Saughall All Saints' Church of England Primary School is expected to open in the autumn. It will have 10 classrooms sited to make the best of natural light, a large hall, library, group rooms, practical areas, a home economics area, dedicated secure outdoor play areas for foundation pupils, infants and juniors, a wildlife area, football pitches, running track and an outdoor classroom. The hall and main entrance are being located at the front of the building so that it can be used for community use outside of school hours and a pedestrian crossing is being installed on Church Road to improve safety.

Wain House Proposed Re-Development

Chester District Housing Trust has decided to re-develop Wain House and five bungalows at Rakeway. It is consulting surrounding residents and hopes to start on site within the next 12 months. It will submit its planning application to the planning authority, Cheshire West and Chester Council soon. Planning Officers will then ask the Parish Council for its observations on the application as it is a statutory consultee. The Council has already decided to consider this application itself rather than leaving it to its Planning Committee to make any observations.

Affordable Housing Scheme

The Housing Needs Survey identified a need for affordable housing to be built in Saughall. Unfortunately, there has been another set back in respect of this initiative. Northern Affordable Homes Ltd who reached an agreement with Cheshire County Council to purchase land behind Lodge Lane on which to build 12 low cost dwellings went into administration last year and will not be able to proceed.

We still wish to take this proposal forward and have held a meeting with Officers of the principal authorities and a housing trust to see what can be done. It has been agreed that negotiations will commence and we will be kept up to date on any progress made.

Traffic Issues

Traffic congestion, issues with the buses, damage to grass verges, parking and speeding cars are recurring themes at Council meetings. We work with the Police, the Highways Authority and the bus companies to try to remedy these problems. Councillors and volunteers have been trained to use a speed gun and a speed indicator device, which we borrow from the principal authority. Speed checks will be repeated often, as a deterrent, for those who regularly offend.

The Peg Lay-by

The lay-by at the Peg was revamped and remarked in February. It is an official bus stop and it is an offence to park in it. So if you do and you are caught you will receive a fine.

A5117 Major Road Works

The A5117 Deeside Park Junctions Improvement Scheme to reduce congestion, increase safety and support regeneration by removing three bottleneck junctions was officially opened on 3 March 2009. The Highways Agency's Chief Executive, Graham Dalton, marked the formal

completion of the £61 million scheme by unveiling a plaque at the site.

The new three-mile road cuts out the congestion at the A550, A540 and M56 junctions. Road users are already seeing the benefits of it. As well as reducing delays and improving road safety, the improvements will help boost economic regeneration by improving access between England and Wales.

Planning

The Council is a statutory consultee on all planning applications in its area. It provides a focal point for the views of local residents and has an opportunity to support or oppose each application. In the course of this Municipal year the Council has dealt with 38 applications compared with 47 last year.

Christmas Lights Celebration - Thursday, 27 November 2008

The Christmas Lights Switch-On Ceremony outside the Greyhound Public House was a very successful event held during the current Municipal year. There were approximately 500 people in attendance including Father Christmas, and there were refreshments, music and entertainment laid on. The event was well supported and enjoyed by the community and the £300 profit made was donated to the Vernon Institute.

I would like to say a special thank you to Councillor Jean Johnson and the volunteers who sat on the Steering Group giving up their time to meticulously organise the event. Jean has agreed to lead the organisation of a similar Christmas event in 2009.

Family Fun Day - Monday, 5 May 2008

Approximately 2,000 people attended and enjoyed the Family Fun Day held last spring to mark the official opening of the Golden Jubilee Park by Councillor Andrew Storrar, then Sheriff of Chester. Councillor Ian Humphrey led a Task Group of volunteers who made all of the arrangements. It was very well organised and demonstrated village life at its very best bringing the community together.

There were various stalls including, tombola, cakes, ice cream, refreshments, a bar, games and activities for people of all ages. It proved to be, without doubt, a very exceptional day and generated income, including donations, of £824, which will be ploughed back into the development. Well done everyone!

The Parish Council is willing to support an annual "Family Fun Day" if enough volunteers come forward to help make the necessary arrangements. If you are interested in helping please let us know.

Dog Fouling

The Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996 makes it an offence to allow your dog to foul in public areas and allows local councils to make on the spot fines.



Clear up after your dog. Put it in one of the many bins provided or take it home with you.

Also, in the interests of health and safety, dogs are not allowed on any of the Council owned land on Fiddlers Lane. Enforcement action will be taken if your dog is found to be on this land.



Keep Saughall Tidy

Don't drop litter, put it in one of the many litter bins dotted around the village or take it home.

Think Before You Park!

Please do not park on grass verges or on footpaths.



Problems continue because cars are being parked on pavements, resulting in the elderly and disabled being unable to pass with safety. This is happening in many places, but particularly in the areas of The Ridings and Thomas Wedge Schools at dropping off and pick-up times. Dropped kerbs, which have been introduced to help the disabled, are being blocked by parked cars. Please ensure that you are not putting the elderly at risk.

Remember there are people with prams and pushchairs who will have to step out into the road to get passed your car. Also, have a thought for those who are wheelchair bound.

Cars continue to park on and destroy the grass verge on Long Lane.

The Police have been informed of all inappropriate parking "hot spots" and Traffic Wardens and the PCSO will ticket anyone who causes an obstruction.

1. Gently fry the onion, mushrooms and chopped bacon using Fry Light until they are softened and the bacon starts to brown.
2. Place all the ingredients, except the pasta into a deep saucepan or casserole pot, along with the stock cube. Top the pan up with water.
3. Simmer for 20 minutes then add the pasta and simmer for a further 5-10 minutes
